FINANCIAL AID DATA

For the Class of 2013, financial aid of approximately \$27,000,000 was offered to 1,140 students. The aid consisted of approximately \$20,500,000 in Bucknell scholarships, \$1,000,000 in other grants, \$4,800,000 in student loans and \$700,000 in work-study.

Of the enrolled members of the Class of 2013, 525 students will receive approximately \$14,550,000 in financial aid. That aid is distributed as \$10,800,000 in Bucknell scholarships, \$850,000 in other grants, \$2,600,000 in student loans and \$300,000 in work-study.

The average total financial aid package for first-year students with financial need is approximately \$25,000, which includes grants, scholarships, loans and work-study.

The average loan debt upon graduation is approximately \$19,500.

Sixty-three percent of undergraduates receive some form of financial aid.
