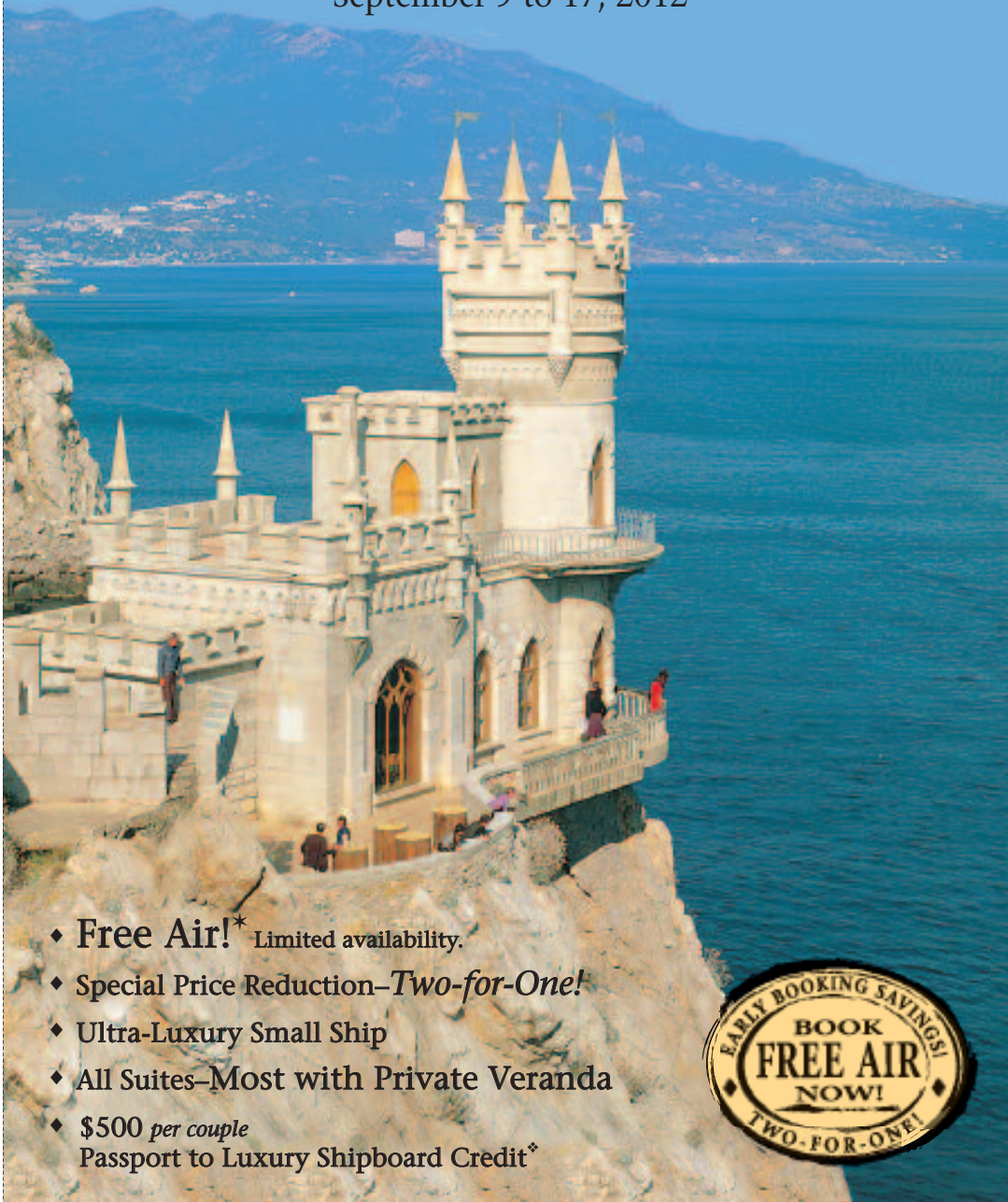

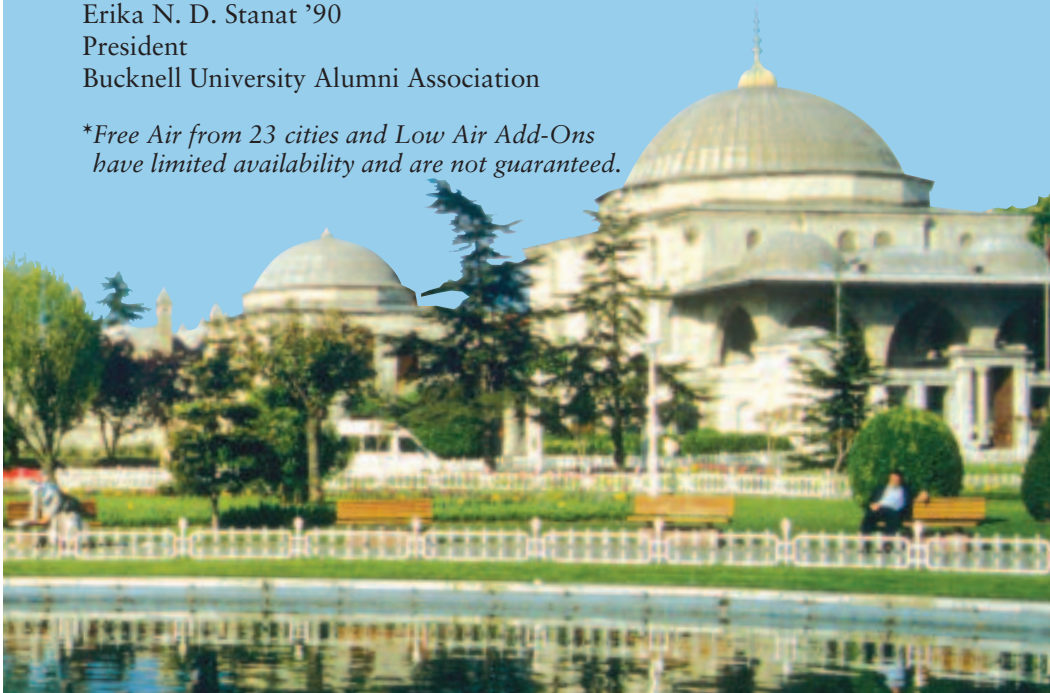

## Istanbul, Turkey

This legendary metropolis straddling the Bosphorus Strait is one of the loveliest cities in Europe and most splendid in Asia. Its position at the crossroads for trade and cultural exchange over

centuries have filled the city with beautiful architecture and magnificent monuments inspired by the region's diverse faiths.

Its historic areas, a UNESCO World Heritage site, include the Hagia Sophia, Topkapi Palace and the Blue Mosque.

## Yalta, Ukraine

Considering the natural beauty of the historic Crimean Peninsula's mountainous southern coast of majestic, 5,000-foot peaks rising dramatically from the Black Sea, its lower slopes cloaked in a mantle of Mediterranean oak, pistachio and juniper, it is no wonder that Yalta was a favorite seaside retreat for czars, commissars and literary giants, including Leo Tolstoy and Anton Chekhov. During the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, the Russian nobility flocked here to bask in the abundant sunshine and breathe the invigorating sea air. In 1911, Czar Nicholas II, the last of the Romanovs, built Livadia Palace, a Renaissance-style mansion of white granite, as a summer residence for his family.

It was at Livadia, in February 1945, the historic Yalta Conference was held, where Franklin D. Roosevelt, Winston Churchill and Josef Stalin determined the post-World War II status of Germany and Eastern Europe.

## Sevastopol

The Crimean port of Sevastopol is built upon terraced hills overlooking a magnificent natural harbor. The former headquarters of Russia's mighty Black Sea Fleet, which guarded the country's southern border under the

czars and the Soviets, today is an open-air museum dotted with hundreds of impressive monuments and memorials, recently rediscovered as the port remained closed to the outside world until 1990. The Sevastopol Panorama Museum offers a sweeping view of the city and harbor and impressive displays depicting the 1855 Battle of Sevastopol, a key engagement in the Crimean War. Nearby are the impressive excavated ruins of Kherones—a Greek trading settlement established in 421 B.C.—and the museum showcasing its artifacts, and Bakhchisarai—Garden Palace—the opulent seat of the Tatar Khans who ruled Crimea from 1427 to 1783. The Khan's Palace is noted for its harmonious blend of Persian, Turkish and Italian architectural elements and its legendary Fountain of Tears, which inspired Aleksandr Pushkin's great poem *The Fountain of Bakhchisaray*.

In the Archaeological and Natural History Museum, intriguing artifacts from the Greco-Roman era include the third-century B.C. Glykon Serpent. One of the most notable pieces of Roman archaeological fragments is a third-century mosaic that may have been part of the ancient Roman baths once located near the museum's lower terrace. Today, many elegant mansions and hotels remain from the 19<sup>th</sup> century, when King Carol I decided to revive the city as a port and seaside resort.

## Nessebur, Bulgaria

The small port of Nessebur is a sixth-century B.C. Greek-founded town and a UNESCO World Heritage site. Despite covering only one-tenth of one square mile along the rocky coast, Nessebur is a synthesis of centuries-old

## Odessa

Founded by Catherine the Great in 1789 to guard the southern approaches to her empire, Odessa, "The Pearl of the Black Sea," is a graceful city of tree-lined avenues and Franco-Italian architecture. The city's iconic feature is the majestic Potemkin Stairs, extending from the harbor to the city center and immortalized in Sergei Eisenstein's cinema classic, *The Battleship Potemkin*. You may choose to stroll down tree-lined Deribasovskaya Street, the city's lively commercial heart; relax in a café in the glass-vaulted Passazh Corridor; or visit the ornate Odessa Opera House and Ballet, rebuilt by Austrian architects in 1887. Beneath the city, through the sandstone on which Odessa lies, is a vast network of catacombs that were unearthed during the 19<sup>th</sup> century and have since served as hiding places and smuggling routes during World War II.

## Constanța, Romania

Legend has it that Jason and the Argonauts landed in Constanța after finding the Golden Fleece. This principal seaport in Romania was established as the Greek trading settlement of Tomis in the sixth century B.C., later ruled by Romans, Byzantines and Ottoman Turks, and today remains a magnificent composite of all these civilizations.

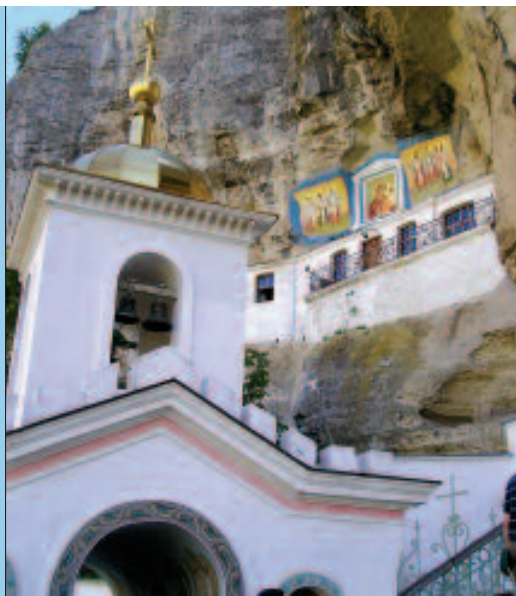

civilizations and proudly preserves 11 Byzantine-influenced churches and many fine 19<sup>th</sup>-century timber houses. The 13<sup>th</sup>- to 14<sup>th</sup>-century stone and redbrick Pantokrator Church is the town's loveliest and best preserved. In the center of Old Nessebur, not far from the Byzantine town gate, are the remnants of St. Sofia Church, built in the late fifth and early sixth centuries.

*Gothic, Northern European and Moorish styles blend together seamlessly in Crimea's stunning 19<sup>th</sup>-century Alupka Palace, featuring beautifully landscaped grounds with a staircase leading down to the sea.*

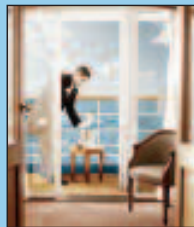

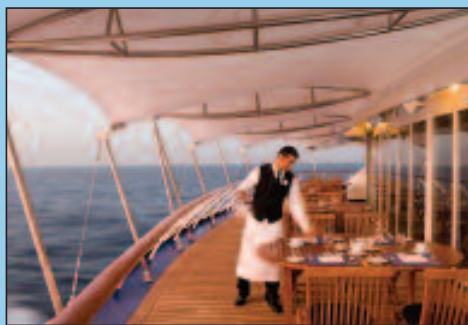

## In the Footsteps of History

A highway of commerce, conquest and ideas since the fifth century B.C., the stunningly beautiful Crimean Peninsula and surrounding Black Sea countries showcase a 21<sup>st</sup>-century tapestry of cultural treasures woven together over millennia of ruling Greeks, Goths, Huns, Ottoman Turks, Golden Horde Tatars, Mongols, Venetians and Genovese.

Walk in the footsteps of Greek colonists who founded the city of Kherones, the Roman Legions who arrived in the first century A.D. and Catherine the Great, who on her first visit in 1787 to this idyllic setting and mild climate blooming with lush flora, was greeted by a cavalcade of 12,000 Tatar horsemen dressed in ceremonial uniform, who escorted her to the Khan's Palace.

Explore the cultural treasures left by Russian royalty, who subsequently flocked to the Crimean Riviera and built lavish summer palaces that still display the opulent social legacy of the czars.

You will even have an opportunity to stroll through the corridors and garden of Livadia, Czar Nicholas II's favorite summer residence and later the site of the world-changing Yalta Conference in February of 1945, where the "Big Three," U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt, British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and Russian General Secretary Joseph Stalin, met to determine Europe's postwar reorganization.

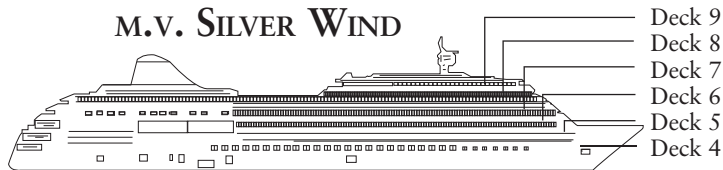
Learn more about the Crimean War, the first modern war, which was famously documented in Alfred Lord Tennyson's poem "The Charge of the Light Brigade," and how it illuminated the efforts of a young British nurse, Florence Nightingale, whose work pioneered advances in the nursing profession and inspired Swiss social activist Henry Dunant to implement the Red Cross Movement shortly thereafter.

A relevantly new destination now open to the Western world, the deep blue waters of the Black Sea, the Crimea's spectacular scenery, expansive vineyards and endearing people beckon travelers to delve into its rich history.
