

BUCKNELL UNIVERSITY SURVIVOR'S BILL OF RIGHTS

The following rights shall be afforded to survivors of sexual misconduct.

You have the right:

- To seek help and have your privacy protected.
- To be treated with dignity and respect.
- To be believed and to be given the same credibility as any other victim of crime regardless of race, ethnicity, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, age, religion, disability status or sexual history.
- To contact a Bucknell Sexual Assault Survivor Advocate to receive confidential support and information regarding medical, academic, counseling and legal options.
- To be informed of medical, counseling, and other support services available at Bucknell University and in the community, regardless of whether or not the crime is reported to campus or local authorities.
- To be informed of your options to report to local law enforcement and Bucknell University, as well as the option to be assisted by an Advocate or other trained campus personnel in notifying such authorities, if so requested.
- To be informed of options for changing academic and living situations as well as the option to be assisted by relevant campus personnel in making reasonable accommodations, as requested.
- To have a University hearing advisor present at a campus conduct hearing.
- To be informed of the outcome of any campus conduct hearing.
- To live and learn in a university community that is safe, supportive and free from interpersonal violence.
